The policy of internal rotation/ transfer of officials is adopted to give maximum exposure. Human Resources are managed by the wisdom of scholars at the university level. Department always tries to collaborate with scholars. It was optimized by assigning more than one kind of responsibility to teaching and non-teaching staff and thus making more work done by existing employees.
