SYLLABUS AND SCHEME OF EXAMINATION FOR :

(A) <u>Certificate of Proficiency in Russian.</u>

Minimum Eligibility for Admission: (+2)/ Higher Secondary in any discipline or equivalent.

The **Certificate of Proficiency in Russian** is a One–Year' running course, consisting of two semesters.

There shall be one written exam at the end of the First Semester, while one written and one Viva-Voce examination at the end of the Second Semester.

A short written Project Work/ assignment to be submitted by the 2nd week of February during the Second Semester of the said course shall from a part of Paper-III (Viva-Voce). The last date for submission of the Project Work may be extended by the Head of the Department in exceptional circumstances.

The pass-marks are 40% in each paper/course, and 48% in the aggregate of all the papers/ courses prescribed for the First and Second Semesters, i.e., Papers–I, II, and III. First Division will be assigned at 60% or above and the rest will be placed in the Second Division, if the candidates qualify in each course.

Aims & Objectives:

- I. Acquisition and development of the basic, i.e., listening, speaking, reading and writing skills by the learners.
 - i. Listening : To listen and understand the spoken language.
 - ii. Speaking : To engage in simple dialogues.
 - iii. Reading : To read and understand elementary texts.
 - iv. Writing : To write simple sentences and short paragraphs.
- II. Giving the learners the mastery of and the ability to manipulate the basic grammatical structures of the language and the most essential vocabulary items.
- III. Exposing the learners to the relevant aspects of life and culture of the Russian people.

Syllabus: Parts of speech, Phonetics, Morphology and elementary syntax. During the course, emphasis will be placed on written and spoken Russian and translation of Russian prose into English / Hindi and Vice-versa, with the help of dictionary.

- 1. Communicative Russian: Functional Grammar based on the textbook.
- 2. Text Comprehension and Written expression: Comprehension of simple texts and précis writing.
- 3. Oral Expression: Reading of texts, general questions based on day-to-day life. Material to be provided by the department.
