# **SYLLABUS & SCHEME OF EXAMINATIONS FOR :**

## (C) ADVANCED DIPLOMA IN FRENCH LANGUAGE & LITERATURE :

Minimum Eligibility for Admission - Graduation in any discipline and Diploma in French Language or equivalent.

The Advanced Diploma in French Language & Literature course consists of two semesters. There shall be one written exam at the end of the First Semester, while one written and one Viva-Voce examination at the end of the Second Semester.

A Project Work to be submitted by the 2nd week of February during the II semester of the said course shall from a part of paper -III (Viva-Voce). The last date for submission of the Project–Work may be extended by the Head of the Department in exceptional circumstances.

The pass-marks are 40% in each paper/course, and 48% in the aggregate of all the papers/ courses prescribed for the First and Second Semesters, i.e., Papers–I, II, and III. First Division will be assigned at 60% or above and the rest will be placed in the Second Division, if the candidates qualify in each course.

<u>Aims & Objectives</u>: Introduction to the works of the principal figures of the French literature, in original. Translation skills. Reinforcing the previous knowledge of the learners about the life and socio-cultural aspects of different regions of modern-day France, and that of France vis-à-vis Europe and the world.

<u>Syllabus</u>: Translation skills: Translation of French Texts into English and Vice-Versa. Practical French: situational usage of language. (Grammar and usage of special constructions, phrases etc). Introduction to the works of the principal figures of French Literature in original. Supplementary material to be provided by the department.

#### Semester I : Paper – I.

This paper has two parts :

## (a). Initiation to translation:

In this part, the students will be asked to do practical exercises to enable them to translate short texts (**not** more than 100 words), such as, letters both, formal and informal, short articles from the press, advertisements, etc.

#### (b). Culture and civilisation:

In this part, the learners will answer the questions on the following themes:

- I. Différentes régions de la France (Chapter 3, from Prescribed Text-book 1).
- II. La Francophonie (Chapter 12, from Prescribed Text-book 1).
- III. La France dans l'Europe et dans le monde (Chapter 11, from Prescribed Text-book 1).

#### Semester II : Paper – II, Introduction to French Literature.

An introduction to literary genres, and movements through the works of the following authors in the original.

- (i). La Fontaine :
  'Le Cigale et la Fourmi',
  'le laboureur et ses enfants'
- (ii). **Molière:** 'Le malade imaginaire' (extracts)
- (iii) **Hugo:** 'Demain dès l'aube'
- (iv). Alphonse Daudet : 'La dernière leçon' 'La chèvre de M. Séguin'

(v). Lamartine : 'le Lac'

- (vi) **Maupassant:** 'La parure', 'Mademoiselle Fifi'
- (vii) Albert Camus: 'L'Étranger'
